This 125-year-old venue underwent a £250,000 transformation in 2021, reopening its doors with a smart new look and the addition of a contemporary café.

The bar area received a full makeover, but the traditional charm for which is it known remains, along with its bar lined with real ales alongside a fantastic range of other drinks. Inside you find locals chatting over a good pint by the log burner and on match days the buzz of local football and rugby fans as they meet up on their way to the game.

The new addition to this venue is Café West which provides a great separate space for people to grab a coffee and bite to eat in a relaxed atmosphere away from the busy pub area. This really is an exciting space with bags of potential that's calling out for someone to maximise.
